Student and Alumni News Items:

- 57 undergraduate students were named to the President's list for Spring 2012 (GPA of 3.8 or greater).
- 27 undergraduate students were named to the Dean's list for Spring 2012 (GPA between 3.5 and 3.8).
- Undergraduate student Alison Cuevas was awarded a national scholarship from the Buick Achievers Scholarship Program.

School News Items:

- Alumnus William Steen has made a pledge to endow a freshman scholarship - the first of which will be awarded this semester.
- Dr. Keisha Walters has been selected to serve as Mississippi State University's faculty representative in the Phase V Federal Demonstration Partnership (www.thefdp.org), comprised of 120 institutions with at least 10 federal agencies. The emphasis of Phase V of the FDP is to streamline the processes of research administration with the end goal being to allow the researcher to concentrate on their science and to be less burdened with administrative issues.
- Dr. Rafael Hernandez, Dr. Patrishia Pham, Dr. Andro Mondala, Dr. Emmanuel Revellame, and Mr. Bill Holmes helped organize two biofuels camps associated with the Southeast Biofuels and Renewable Energy Conference. The camps were funded in part by the National Science Foundation and Hearn funds. There were separate camps for 6-12 yr olds and teenagers.
- Both camps were educational, engaging, and fun. Participants were introduced to production of biodiesel and ethanol from soybean oil and corn, respectively. The attendees were informed about the problems associated with producing biofuels using food related feedstocks. They were shown other alternatives to producing biofuels, such as the integration of biomass, wastewater treatment facilities, and microorganisms. All of these educational materials were presented in the form of games, experiments, and videos.
- The MSU football schedule was released recently, with home games on Sept 1 (Jackson State), Sept 8 (Auburn), Sept 22 (South Alabama), Oct 13 (Tennessee), Oct 20 (Middle Tennessee), Nov 3 (Texas A&M), and Nov 17 (Arkansas). CHE tailgates will begin 3 hours prior to kickoff, to be held in the student lounge and Eastman Auditorium on the ground floor of the Swalm Chemical Engineering building.
